Hi Paul,

I just spoke with Sal Raia about the project at 29 Arcadia St. I told him there is some question about whether the second dwelling unit here was ever legally permitted by the city. The 1950 tax card calls it a single-family, then a building permit in 1968 called it a 2-family, and then later permits in 1970 and 1975 went back to calling it a

single-family. We generally look at the use on the most recent permit (1975) as the "legal use". I recommended that he have you update the current permit application to formally request a change of use from single-family to two-family, which he agreed to do. This will entail a \$100 fee for the new Certificate of Occupancy and then the question will be resolved permanently.

Would you be able to e-mail me a revised building permit application form with this new information?

The other thing I was hoping you could provide is a simple plot plan just showing the layout of the buildings on the lot and in particular the size, location, and setbacks of the staircase to be rebuilt?

Please let me know if you have any questions about this, and thanks for your help.
