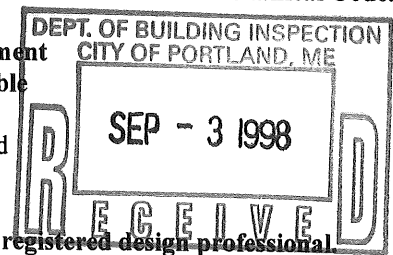

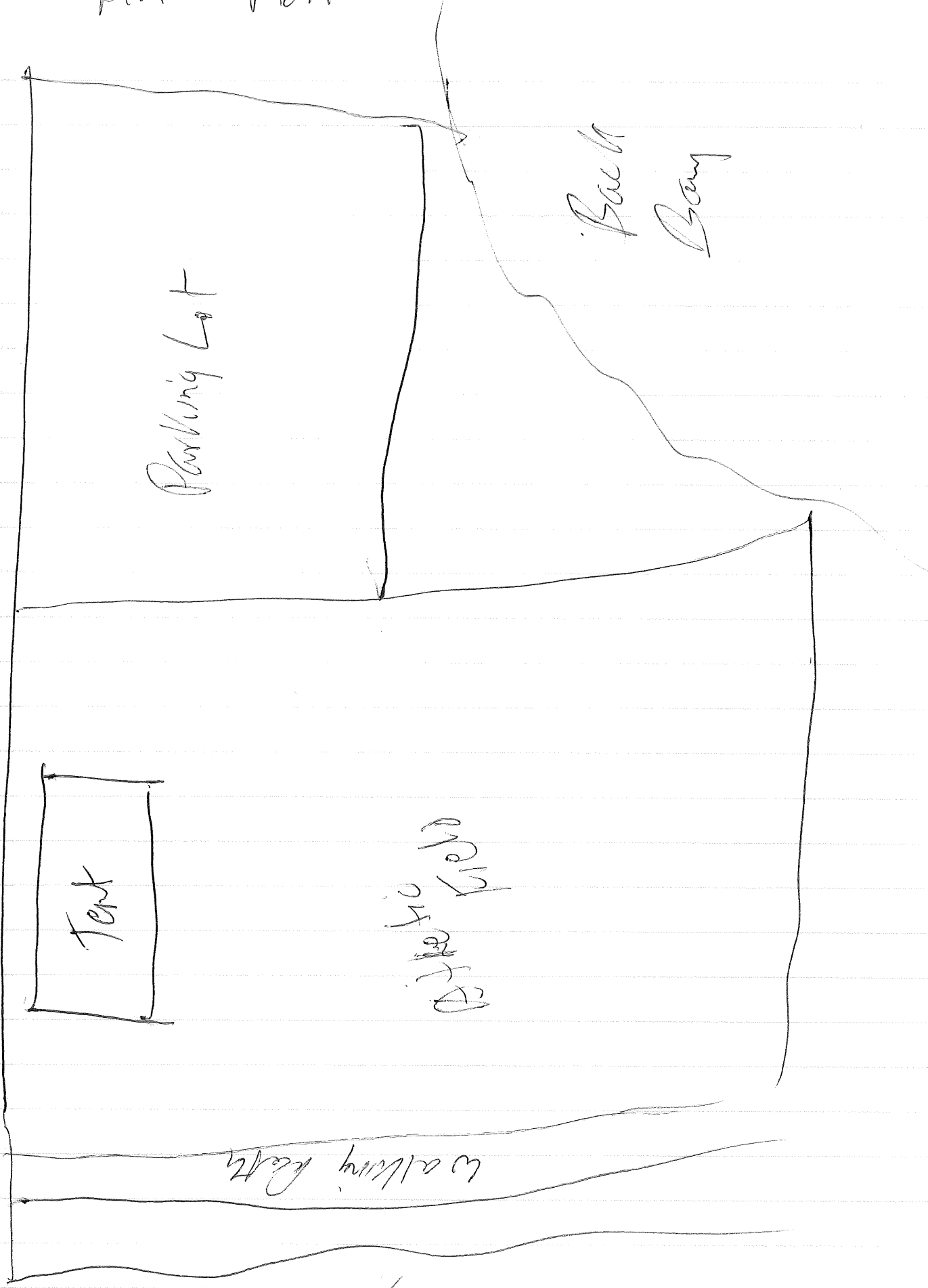

Dear Irvin:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter requesting permission to hold a "Convoy for Kids" on Saturday, September 12, 1998, from 10am to 11am. Following the 100 truck convoy (large and small trucks) will be a mini-festival for children and their families at Preble St grass area. The convoy is being held to raise funds for "Operation Liftoff" which makes wishes come true for terminally ill children. There is no rain date. Thank you for forwarding the permit fee.

The convoy starts at the end of Commercial Street (at the Merrill Marine Terminal), heads down Commercial St. to Franklin St. Arterial, takes a left onto Franklin St. Arterial, then takes a left onto Congress Street, takes a right onto High Street, then takes a right onto Marginal Way, takes a left onto Preble Street, and then ends by taking a right into the Preble St. Parking Lot. Trucks will be parked in one half of the parking lot nearest the field (on the dirt and tar). You have asked for a police lead and follow car, as well as police officers stationed at busy intersections, to assist the truck convoy. Traffic would continue to flow on the opposite side of the streets. Barb Hager, President of Portland's Downtown District, has endorsed your convoy for the downtown area.

The small festival at the Preble Street grass area will begin at 11am and end at approximately 2pm. It will include games, a moon bounce, face painting, dunk tank, food booths, and truck rides for the kids. These activities (except for the truck rides) will be set up on the grass area beside the Preble St. soccer field. You have asked that two tents be set up on the grass area.

Please be advised that I have forwarded a street closing memo to the City Manager for his approval of the truck convoy. Once the City Manager approves the temporary closing of streets, then you are authorized to hold the convoy and the children's festival, subject to the following conditions:

1. Please forward a revised certificate of insurance listing the city of Portland as an additional insured in regards to your festival and convoy on that date to this office. Coverage should include product liability as well as general liability. Your insurance company may fax in a copy: 756-8390.

2. In anticipation of City Manager approval, please contact Sgt. Sully Rizzo, 874-8513 or 8532, to schedule officers for the convoy. If on duty officers can not man the convoy, then you will need to cover the costs of hiring officers for the convoy. Please speak to Sully regarding the necessary details and intersections that need to be covered.

3. For your children's festival, please plan on participants parking at the Marginal Way parking lot. IF THE GRASS AREA IS WET THEN YOUR FESTIVAL WILL NEED TO TAKE PLACE AT MARGINAL WAY. Please call John Wone, Fields Coordinator, 874-8793, for this determination.

4. There is a chain across the entrance to the Preble Street grass area. Please call the Parks & Recreation office: (874-8793), for the key to gain access. There is a \$25 security deposit for the key. Please make sure that all vehicles are removed from the grass area once items are dropped off.

5. There may be soccer or lacrosse games taking place at the field during your event (please follow up with John Wone, P&R Fields Coord., 874-8793). The area near the entrance needs to be kept open for any buses or vehicles coming in to drop off players. It is understood that some of the trucks from the convoy will be taking up spaces in the Preble St. lot.

6. For your tents, a tent permit needs to be acquired from the Inspections Division, 874-8703. The tents will be placed near the sidewalk area, and not close to the field area. The tents may be set up the night before if you wish. However, the city takes no responsibility for any damage that may occur to the tents while they are there. It is imperative that you call DIG SAFE (1-888-343-7233) so that they may mark water, gas, and electrical lines. If need be, please call this office for the gate to be unlocked. Please make sure that the tents are taken down and removed from the site Saturday evening.

7. For electricity, there are outlets on the pole in the parking lot (two 20-amp outlets). Please call Maynard Sprague or Jackie Wurslin, Public Works Customer Service (874-8460 or 8462) to discuss reserving barricades to place across the first entrance so that vehicles will not be driving over the electrical extension cord that will run from the pole to the grass area. You may be required to pick these up yourself; there will be a security deposit charged. (Please plan on bringing at least 200 feet of heavy duty extension cord.) Please check electricity in advance. Please call me to borrow the key to the fuse box, in case you need to reset a breaker. There is a \$25 deposit to borrow this key.


8. For the serving of food, please call Laurie Savona or one of her associates at the City Clerk's Office (874-8557), to receive a Temporary Food Service License. Please make sure that only portable gas grills are used for the cookouts if you are having any.

9. You will be responsible for any trash generated at your event. The trash must be removed from the area immediately following your event unless otherwise arranged through Donn Mathews, Parks Coordinator, 874-8793. Please plan on bringing trash bags. Also, please speak to Donn regarding the possible use of water at the Preble St. grass area, if there is any access to it. Otherwise, you will have to rely on other means to fill up the dunk tank.

10. I understand that you will be renting porta-potties for the day. Please make sure that these are placed on dirt areas (near the entrance gate) and removed from the parking lot no later than Monday, September 14.

Good luck with the convoy and children's festival. If I may be of further assistance, please call me: 874-8793. (I will be on vacation starting Aug. 24, returning to work Sept. 8; please ask for Carol McClure, P&R Customer Service Manager, during my absence). As I anticipate the revised certificate of insurance arriving shortly, this letter will act as your formal permit to hold the children's festival at Preble Street grass area; please bring it with you to the event. The formal permit for use of the streets for the convoy will be issued once the City Manager approves the street closure memo (Carol McClure may be responding back to you with this information).
