Dear Mr. Gilmartin:

One look at the building at 9-11 Chatham Street, photo attached, subject to your letter of April 5, 1940, shows that it is not only worthless but a threatening fire hazard.

It ought to be removed as soon as possible, and I suggest that whoever actually does the work be bound in writing to fill any depression there may be below the original ground level or the lot next door with incombustible material of such a nature on top that it will not dust or blow about the neighborhood. If that is not possible, it will be necessary to fence the property.



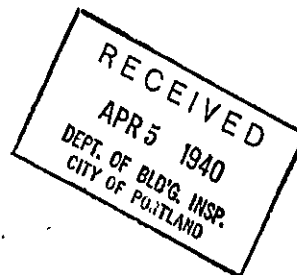

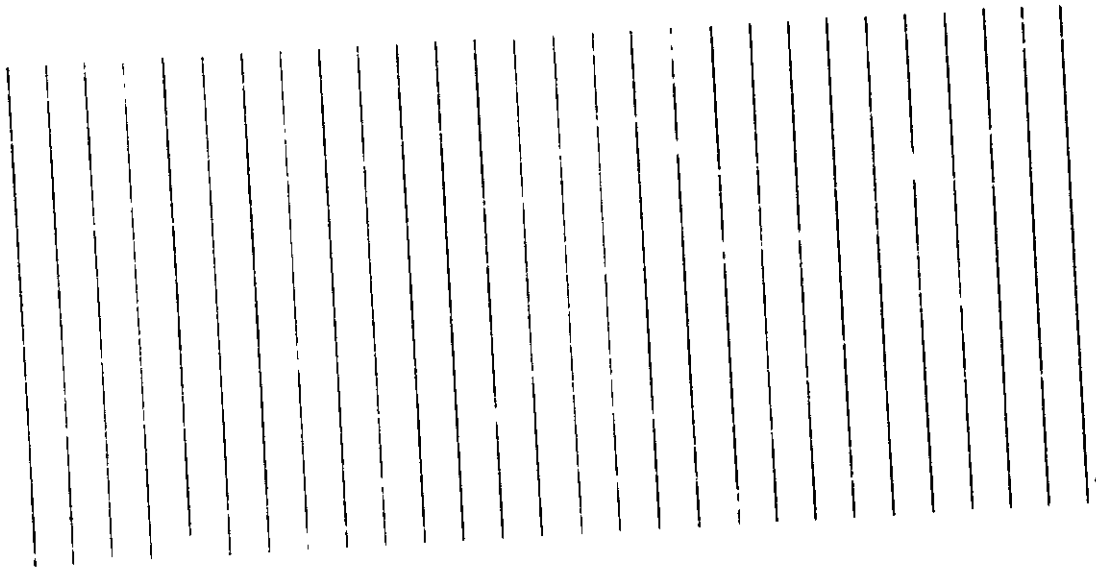
