

This letter is the first report on the progress being made by the Policy Board and membership of Youth in Action, Inc. to bring the People's Building at 155 Bracket St. up to code and back into community service. A committeent was made to your office and the Portland Fire Department to initially clean all trash from the facility and board up all windows. This has been accomplished through two volunteer community clean-ups. The Program/Building through two volunteer community clean-ups. The Program/Building Committee of the Policy Board, chaired by Mr. James Tiernie, Regional Director of the Department of Human Services, has recommended to the full Policy Board the following concerning the People's Building: the full Policy Board the following concerning the People's Building:

- That the facility no longer serve as a youth drop-in center.
- 2. That space within the facility be rented out to groups and organizations doing community service (with the stipulation that such space usage be checked out first with Portland's building inspectoric office and firedometric. building inspector's office and firedepartment.
- That a comprehensive building plan be developed including a budget, program, rehabilitation, control and security.

At this point, Lyle, we have a number of community groups indicating interest in renting space. Two of the more serious considerations are Profile Theater, who wish to use either the 1st or 3rd floors for rehersal and the construction of props. DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

Writer was assigned to the People's Building at 155 Brackett St. at approximately 2011 hrs. this date reference a working fire. Upon arrival, writer spoke with Dist. Chief Winslow, who stated the fire was minor in nature, but definitely arson. At least two fires had been set; one to the door frame on the north side of the building and one on the window sill and floor below to the southwest side of the building. Regs and paper appeared to be the kindling. There was also evidence of several small fires set inside previously. These appear to have been set for light and heat while youths were drinking in the building.

Writer spoke with a Carolyn Stiman, who works for Youth in Action. She stated Youth In Action owns the building and it has not been used for some time. Ms.. Stiman stated she had not been in the building for several weeks.

The building could not be totally secured this date and special attention was requested until the beginning of the week. Writer feels there will most likely be more attempts.

Youth In Action office is currently located at 62 High St. in the Urban Adult Conter. Evidence Technician J. Whitmore photographed the scene.

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DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

At 2024 hours, writer was dispatched to the People's Blding, Reference an arson at that location for Sgt. Keller and the F.D. Upon strivel, writer met with District Chief Winslow who advised the writer that when his units arrived, they found two fires in the building. One originated at the side door of the building, on the north side, and the other was started by breaking a window on the south side of the building tearing the screen away from the window, and throwing burning rubbish into the building. The side door, which is comprised of pressed sawdust, apparently either had rubbish jammed into the Goor frame or sceething was leaned up against it. As far as could be determined by Chief Winslow and the writer, no other sceelerants were used.

DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

At that location we talked to Corolyn Stimak and she told the writer that she and Charles Morrison are the people that are in charge of the building. She told the writer that there is no incurence on the foulding and that the City gave the building to them, and that there is no present need for the building. She said that there has been a problem as far as the kids in the neighborhood who would hang around after the councilors leave for the night. She stated the kids have been drinking in there and also she told the writer that she would try to make the building more secure and check the building more often.

Dear Mr. Troubh:

We are writing you in reference to the People's Building at 155 Bracket. Street. We are sure you share with us our concern about the vandalish coat recently occurred at the building.

We want to assure you that contrary to some press reports or rumor, the vandalism did not occur during the summer, but rather took place over the Labor Day weekend. In fact many of the members of Youth-in-Action spent most of the summer doing repairs and painting the interior of the building, and getting some of the rooms ready for our fall and winter programs.

The membership of Youth-in-Action responded to the vandalism by immediately going into the building and starting the clean-up.

A series of meetings have been held, and plans developed to go forward both in repairing the damage and developing ongoing programs for the youth in the neighborhood. We have decided to completely close off the top two stories of the building, toarding up the windows on those floors and blocking off entrances to the upper floors. We will put the first floor in order, repair all the windows and hopefully have it ready for use by the young people of the neighborhood in the very near future. Work will begin the week of September 16, 1974.

We have developed some fund raising programs to help us complete our plans. On Saturday, September 14, 1974 for example, we will be running a car wash at the Shell Station on Congress Street. At the same time a number of members will be working at the building. We have secured a truck and will be taking refuse to the dump. We have also secured the services of a skilled workman, who will be supervising the repairs on the building.

In addition to this plans have been made for ongoing fund raising activities that will be combined with program activities. For example we will be putting on a play which will not only be both educational and recreational for the members, but will also serve as a vehicle for raising funds. We are also developing recreation programs, social activities and an education and job counselling program. We will be aided in all this by our staff of UMPG students and volunteers from the community.
