Gentlemen:

The building permit for flooring over the third floor stair well at 817 Congress Street is issued to Mr. Foley, herewith, subject to the following:

The only apparent difference between this application and the permit which lapsed because no work was done, is that this permit calls for a door 6' 9" x 3' 11" to be hinged, presumably in the sheathing used to close over the stair well while the former permit called merely for a 3 x 3 scuttle.

There is some doubt in my mind about this larger door, and if it is not planned to be in the sheathing over of the stair well at this floor level, or if this larger door would occupy substantially the total area of the present stair well, please refrain from starting the work, and return the permit card immediately for adjustment. It was my understanding that use of this third floor apartment was to be practically abandoned, and the space not used for anything but perhaps incidental storage in connection with the household use of the building. If any other use than incidental household storage is planned there, it is doubtful if that other use would be in compliance with the Building Code.

I understand from Mr. Meehan when this work is completed the undertaking rooms will occupy the entire first story as now, second and third stories on the west side would be one apartment and second floor on the east side would be a single apartment—thus making a combined business building with two family dwelling houses.

While our two departments have done a good job of coordination under the Safety Ordinance--yours issuing the orders after inspection and ours issuing permits for improvements to be made,--

The confusion on the part of many people, who come in here, as to who has ordered them to do what,

The fact that on some jobs a permit has been issued, and the work done, only to have your inspector find that the situation did not then satisfy your order under the law,

And, the fact that you are permitted under the Building Code to exercise discretion as to details of means of egress in an existing building where there is no substantial increase in number of persons accommodated, while we must proceed under the precise terms of the Code unless deviation in this connection is approved by yourself--

leads me to the belief that each situation ought to be checked before any permits are issued, presumably by the inspector in your department who made the inspection on which the original order was based, to see:

1. If the work contemplated will completely satisfy the order.
2. To see, if possible, whether or not there may be some more economical way of satisfying the order, and, if so, to recommend what way to the owner.

To that end there is attached for your consideration applications for permits at the above location.

Remarks relating to this particular job:

This permit calls for closing the stairway and apparently abandoning use of the apartment on the third floor in the part of the building which the applicant indicates as 817 Congress Street. From your order I judge that there are living quarters of some kind on the third floor of both sides of this duplex building. It appears that the owner is cutting down the number of dwelling units from three to two which takes him out of the jurisdiction of the Safety Ordinance. However, will you consider and approve if possible the permit.

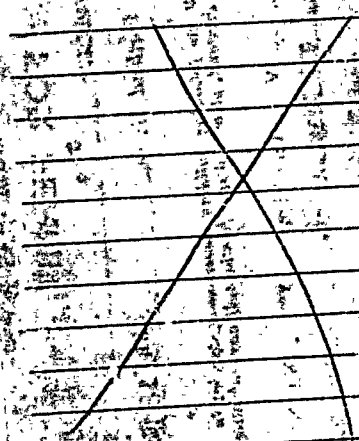
